BOTANICAL NAME	Heuchera merriamii x H. sanguinea hybrid
CULTIVAR NAME	'Blushing Bells'
COMMON NAME	Blushing Bells Coral Bells
FAMILY NAME	Saxifragaceae
ORIGIN	An F1 cross of <i>H. pringlei</i> [Jepson = <i>H.merriamii</i>] and a <i>H. sanguinea</i> hybrid selected by Horticulturist Dara Emery.
GENERAL DESCRIPTION	An herbaceous, evergreen, compact-growing perennial with 1-1.25 inch wide, dark green leaves in 3 inch tall rosettes. Densely clothed 8-12 inch inflorescences of small white to pale pink flowers in spring.
WATER RQUIREMENTS	Summer water required.
SOIL REQUIREMENTS	Best in loamy soil.
EXPOSURE REQUIREMENTS	Best in part shade.
PESTS AND DISEASES	Susceptible to mealybugs in containers, and thrips.
HARDINESS	All Zones. Hardy to 0 F.
LANDSCAPE VALUE	With its matlike growth habit, 'Blushing Bells' makes an excellent border or container plant, or small-scale groundcover. Nice addition to rock gardens.
PROPAGATION	Cuttings or division: Divide clumps every 3 or 4 years in fall (in spring in colder areas). Discard older, woody rootstocks.
SALES POTENTIAL	'Blushing Bells' is a delightful, small-leafed, pale pink <i>Heuchera</i> .
