The Santa Barbara Botanic Garden's Plant Introduction Program "Branching Out" is dedicated to increasing awareness, appreciation, and availability of outstanding California native plants for landscapes and gardens.

BOTANICAL NAME	_ Heuchera elegans x H. sanguinea hybrid
CULTIVAR NAME	_ 'Canyon Belle'
COMMON NAME	_ Canyon Belle Coral Bells
FAMILY NAME	_ Saxifragaceae
ORIGIN	_ An F2 hybrid of <i>H. elegans</i> x a <i>H. sanguinea</i> hybrid selected by Horticulturist Dara Emery.
GENERAL DESCRIPTION	Evergreen, compact herbaceous perennial. Leaves dark green, somewhat glossy, 2 inches wide on rosettes 12+ inches across and 5 inches tall. Rich red flowers on 18 inch stalks in spring.
WATER REQUIREMENTS	_ Summer water required.
SOIL REQUIREMENTS	_ Best in loamy soil.
EXPOSURE REQUIREMENTS	_ Best in part shade.
PESTS AND DISEASES	_ Susceptible to mealybugs in containers, and thrips.
HARDINESS	_ All Zones.
LANDSCAPE VALUE	_ Small-scale groundcover, edging plant, appropriate in rock gardens or in decorative containers.
PROPAGATION	_ Cuttings or division: Divide clumps every 3 or 4 years in fall (in spring in colder areas). Discard older, woody rootstocks.
	_ To commercially propagate this introduction, interested nurseries need to sign a licensing agreement with the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden.
SALES POTENTIAL	Very showy reddish flowers atop glossy foliage add up to a desirable, compact <i>Heuchera</i> for flower gardens.
