 ORIGIN _____ *Heuchera 'Canyon Delight' x H. elegans* selected by Horticulturist
 Dara Emery.
 GENERAL DESCRIPTION _____ Evergreen, compact, mat-like herbaceous perennial. Leaves 1 inch
 wide on rosettes 12+ inches across and 2 inches tall. Dark pink
 flowers on 15 inch stalks in spring.
 WATER REQUIREMENTS _____ Summer water required.
 SOIL REQUIREMENTS _____ Best in loamy soil.
 EXPOSURE REQUIREMENTS _____ Best in part shade.
 PESTS AND DISEASES _____ Susceptible to mealybugs in containers, and thrips.
 HARDINESS _____ All Zones.
 LANDSCAPE VALUE _____ Small-scale groundcover, edging plant, appropriate in rock gardens
 or in decorative containers.
 PROPAGATION _____ Cuttings or division: Divide clumps every 3 or 4 years in fall (in spring
 in colder areas). Discard older, woody rootstocks.
 _____ To commercially propagate this introduction, interested nurseries
 need to sign a licensing agreement with the Santa Barbara Botanic
 Garden.
 SALES POTENTIAL _____ Very reliable coral bell. Blooms in 4" pot. Dark pink flowers borne in
 profusion over a long period.
