BOTANICAL NAME	Heuchera elegans x H. sanguinea hybrid
CULTIVAR NAME	'Canyon Delight'
COMMON NAME	Canyon Delight Coral Bells
FAMILY NAME	Saxifragaceae
ORIGIN	'Canyon Delight' and 'Canyon Pink' were the first products of Dara Emery's breeding program to develop small-leafed, compact coral bells with showy flowers. Both are F1 crosses of <i>H. elegans</i> and a <i>H. sanguinea</i> hybrid.
GENERAL DESCRIPTION	An herbaceous, evergreen perennial reaching 0.5-ft tall by 2 ft wide. Leaves 2 inches wide, medium green. Rose-red flowers bloom on 16 inch stalks in spring.
WATER REQUIREMENTS	Summer water required.
SOIL REQUIREMENTS	Best in loamy soil.
EXPOSURE REQUIREMENTS	Best in part shade.
PESTS AND DISEASES	Susceptible to mealybugs in containers, and thrips.
HARDINESS	All Zones. Hardy to 0 F.
LANDSCAPE VALUE	_ With its profusion of blossoms, 'Canyon Delight' is effective in front of a border or in a decorative pot.
PROPAGATION	_ Cuttings or division: Divide clumps every 3 or 4 years in fall (in spring in colder areas). Discard older, woody rootstocks.
SALES POTENTIAL	_ Remains one of the best medium-sized coral bells. Easy and long-lived.
