A NEW SAGE FROM THE GARDEN — SALVIA 'PACIFIC BLUE'

The botanic garden is pleased to introduce our 33rd cultivar. *Salvia brandegeei* 'Pacific Blue' will appeal to gardeners who covet blue flowers, sages in general, and water-thrifty, durable plants.

Vital statistics:

PLANT FORM	drought deciduous shrub
SIZE	3 to 4 feet tall by 4 to 6 feet wide
LIGHT EXPOSURE	full sun
WATER NEEDS	drought tolerant
SOIL	reasonably well drained
FLOWERS	gentian blue, borne in profusion on 1 to 2 foot stalks in spring
	To maintain a bushy habit, remove the spent flower stalks and cut the upper branches back by 1/3 in late summer or fall.

The chocolate brown seed heads are attractive in dried arrangements, and the nutritious seeds within are eaten by many species of birds. 'Pacific Blue' partners well with a host of drought-tolerant natives, including island bush poppy, our lord's candle, golden yarrow, low-growing coffeeberries, *Lessingia* 'Silver Carpet', bunchgrasses, and dudleyas.
